## Chairman's Corner

By Cllr. Glyn Jones

Since I last wrote my letter to you, Wrexham County Borough Council have informed all Community Councils that due to severe budget cutbacks they are reviewing the provision, management and funding of the facilities that it provides. As a result your Community Council has agreed to provide the maintenance and inspections of the children's playgrounds in the area in order to prevent them from closure. Inevitably this will mean an increase in our precept (the monies that Wrexham County Borough Council provide to conduct our business). We are also reviewing the cost of footway lighting, maintenance and energy, of the street lamp standards away from the A5 and A539, which we may adopt.

As promised in the previous newsletter I will conclude the duties of your Community Council –

- a) Each month considerable correspondence is received by our Clerk and this is reviewed at our meetings and is then circulated for further consideration.
- a) Any matters relating to footpaths and roadways is reviewed including the annual contract for the maintenance of the footpaths for which we are responsible.
- b) We maintain a project fund for each community so that when a request is received for funding we will consider it. Recent funding has been for the re-lettering of the cenotaph in Froncysyllte Church, the provision of plants throughout the area and a contribution to Trevor Church for toilet facilities
- c) As a Council we are the owners of Noddfa cemetery in Garth and are responsible for its upkeep. Annually we conduct a risk assessment of the monuments.
- d) At each meeting our clerk, who is our Responsible Finance Officer, provides a financial statement detailing the receipts, pledges and payments for the previous month together with the current bank balance. The clerk also conducts the annual internal and external audits with the support of the Finance sub-Committee.
- e) Periodically we produce a newsletter, conduct a Garden competition, donate funding to local organisations and conduct a risk assessment of our property in the area.

I hope that the duties of the Council that I have outlined in this and previous newsletters have been useful and give a better understanding of what we do.

As this is my last letter before the festive season I would like to wish you all a happy Christmas and a joyous New Year.

## **Almond Cake with Florentine Topping**

6oz Butter

6oz Caster Sugar

6oz self-raising flour

3oz Almonds

3 Eggs

Set the oven to Gas Mark 4 or elec 180c or fan 160c

Sift the sugar and flour into a bowl, beat the butter till smooth gradually add the flour ground almonds and beaten eggs beat until smooth .

Spoon the mixture into an 8" round tin level the surface and cook for 45 to 50 mins until the centre is set.

## For the topping

3/4.oz butter

3oz caster sugar

4 ½. Level tablespoons golden syrup

3 3/4.07 flaked almonds

2oz of glace cherries of cranberries

½.oz angelica

To make the topping Melt the butter, syrup and sugar together, then stir in the remaining ingredients.

Remove the cake from the oven and add the topping, return the cake to the oven for approx. a further 10 mins or until the flaked almonds start to turn golden brown. Allow the cake to cool for 10 mins before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.





### SOUTH AFRICAN WAR GRAVES AND UNCLE JOHN

Uncle John (John Charles Jones) was a victim of the Boer or South Africa War dying on 10th May, 1900, aged 26, whilst serving as a inthe 2nd Battalion Grenadier Guards. Like so many of his fellow-soldiers he died of enteric fever and was buried in what is now the military section of the Municipal Cemetery of Thaba 'Nchu, which is a small village about 41 miles from Bloemfontein, in the Orange Free State.

My enquiries in 1979-80 to the South African War Graves Board (Kerkstraat-oos 698, Arcadia Pretoria) were answered with the greatest kindness and an efficient courtesy that included a special visit by the Board's secretary to photograph my uncle's grave and its surroundings.

A Drinking Fountain was erected on the main road in the village of Froncysyllte, where they lived, to the memory of my uncle and another casualty, William Williams. I have photographs of the ceremony, in 1910, and the committee which included General Lloyd.

The purpose of this note is to draw members' attention to another aspect of the many sources of information on relatives with a military background.



## CRIMEAN AND BOER WAR ANCESTRY?

Alister Williams, has copies of the casualty returns for the Crimean War, 1854-6, and the Boer War, 1899-1902, with the names of all those men who were either killed, wounded (slightly or severely) or died of disease or accident whilst on active service. He will also bring the lists to meetings.



### **Police Matters**

Over the Halloween/Bonfire period there have no reported incidents in Llangollen Rural related to these festivities which is a credit to the local community. During this period the Police work closely with other Emergency Services including the Fire Brigade who issue the following advice for home safety:-

## Follow North Wales Fire and Rescue Service's 12 top tips for fire safety at home:

- Fit smoke alarms on each level in your home. Test them once a week. Keep them free from dust. NWFRS will fit these for free.
- 2. Make a fire action plan so that everyone in your home knows how to escape if there's a fire.
- Keep the exits from your home clear so that people can escape if there's a fire.
   Make sure that everyone in your home can easily find the keys for doors
   and windows.
- 4. Take extra care in the kitchen never leave young children alone in the kitchen. Never leave cooking unattended.
- 5. Take extra care when cooking with hot oil. Never use a chip pan use a deep-fat fryer which is controlled by a thermostat.
- 6. Never leave lit candles in rooms that nobody is in or in rooms where children are on their own. Make sure candles are in secure holders on a surface that doesn't burn and are away from any materials that could burn.
- 7. Make sure cigarettes are stubbed out properly and are disposed of carefully, and never smoke in bed.
- 8. Get into the habit of closing doors at night. If you want to keep a child's bedroom door open, close the doors to the lounge and kitchen. This may well help save their life if there is a fire.
- 9. Don't overload electrical sockets. Remember one plug for one socket.
- 10. Keep matches and lighters where children can't see or reach them.
- 11. Take special care when you're tired or when you've been drinking.
- 12. Don't leave the TV or other electrical appliances on standby as this could cause a fire. Always switch them off and unplug when not in use.

## Keep responsible - Keep safe!

## **County Councillor's Diary**

This is a brief update of the on going issues within the Llangollen Rural Ward.

We are coming to the end of another year, and the first frost has arrived. I'm pleased to say that all our salt bins have been refilled. With all the Council's cutbacks in the budget, it is likely to affect all front line services, so make sure your cupboards are stocked in case we get snow like last year.

Public Meeting I called this meeting on the 15th October as there were major issues regarding coach parking in Fron basin, and at Fron Community Centre. I chaired this meeting, and in attendance to answer public questions, were representatives from Wrexham Council, Canal & River Trust, and Cruise Boat Operators from Llangollen and Trevor basin. It was a very lively meeting! It was stated by a resident, that there are often three coaches waiting in Fron basin for over two hours. The Boat Operators stated that they have been operating their businesses for the last twenty five years, and were doing nothing different. A petition was also handed in to the Wrexham Council representative with one hundred and fifty signatures, as part of the protest. Sat. Navs. and lack of signage were also to blame. This issue was causing major problems for residents living in the bungalows, with access for ambulances etc. The outcome, will be more signs put in place, to redirect the coaches to the appropriate parking at Trevor. The Chairman of Fron Community Centre gave an assurance, that there will not be any parking of coaches at the Fron Community Centre. I also set a site meeting up on the 25th October, with Ken Skates AM, and local Community Councillor Jim Davies, to see how we can improve the appearance of the village and the A5 trunk road.

**Playground** A bid has now been submitted to refurbish, and update the playground at George Avenue Trevor. Special thanks to everyone for their letters of support, Garth School Children and their staff, and Sue Jones Clerk of the Community Council. This bid will go before the panel in February. The bid is for 45k.

The new Dee Valley Federation of the three schools, Garth, Fron and Pentre has now been completed. I feel this was the only way forward, to save our village schools, and I wish them every success.

**Bont Bridge**, discussions are now on-going with Wrexham County Borough Council about limiting the access across the bridge to large vehicles. We have already seen new signage and hopefully in the near future this problem will be solved.

I would like to say a special thank you to a Fron resident, Mrs Pat Wilson who again has raised £200, and donated it very kindly to this years Christmas party. What a fantastic achievement! Overall I feel we have had another extremely busy year. We are now looking forward to the Christmas events that will be taking place throughout the ward. Thanks to all the Community Councillors, the Clerk Mrs Sue Jones, Amanda Evans and her team, Dave the PCSO, Ken Skates AM for their help and support this past year.
