## **Canal Workforce Update**

The Towpath Taskforce has been working every two weeks during the summer months, and has been trying to catch up with Mother Nature's attempt to make the area look overgrown!

Our work in the basin car park took three visits to get it looking tidy but now that the leaves have fallen, it doesn't seem that we have made much of an impact at all! The benches outside the Visitor Centre and the grey shed were painted during the warm weather and we had some nice comments from visitors and locals.

We have been working on the wharf area opposite the old Jones the Boats site and have tried to clear some of the floating debris at the 'dead end'. Low lying branches have been cut back and the area is now opened for visitors to see the canal earlier, when walking in from the warehouse carpark.

The towpath towards Postle's bridge has had the vegetation cut back as it had been encroaching onto the towpath. The gutters on the ramp off the bridge have been cleared ready for the winter months.

We shall be tackling the vegetation on and around the aqueduct over the next few months as hopefully the amount of visitors will quieten down a bit.

#### **CHAIRMAN'S CORNER**

It is over eighteen months since we published our last Newsletter, and it has been a very difficult time for everyone. Covid 19 has affected every one of us in the community. As a Community Council we have met monthly on Zoom. It has not been a perfect solution, but at least we are able to discuss and act upon the many issues within the community.

Wrexham County Borough Council staff have been working from home, making it increasingly more difficult to get things done.

With more people taking their holidays in this country due to Covid, it has increased the volume of traffic in and around the World Heritage Site. This has created major parking problems in both Trevor and Gate Road in Fron, and this issue must be addressed before next summer.

The closure of the road from Pentre to Rhosymedre since January has caused major problems, particularly when the bypass is closed and traffic is diverted using Gate Road to Trevor. This road was never meant to carry such a volume of traffic. According to the Welsh Government the road in Pentre is not PRIORITY, and no funding is available for two to three years. That suggests to me that the North/South divide is wider than ever. The Council set up a Facebook page in March 2020. The page was created as Llangollen Rural Community Council Coronavirus Support Page and played a vital role in supporting residents throughout the pandemic. The page has been highly effective as a means of sharing information throughout the pandemic, and in supporting individual residents with the collection of prescriptions and shopping. The work of the Facebook page was recognised by Llangollen Health Centre "you have been excellent at sharing our updates on the Community Council's own Facebook page". Our sincere thanks go to Cllr. Keith Sinclair and others for updating this page on a regular basis.

I would also like to express my sincere thanks to my fellow Community Councillors, the Clerk Andrea Evans, and County Councillor Anthony 'Rondo' Roberts for all their hard work and support.

The Community Council has agreed to sponsor and provide prizes for a "Design a Christmas Card" competition for our local primary schools. Also in the community, we will be having a most interesting and creative Christmas window display and garden display competition.

## **County Councillors Update**

I would like to share with you an update about things happening in our area.

The weather is now changing so please keep warm and safe. Hopefully all those eligible have had their Covid injections and the New Year will be an improvement on the last two.

On the home front, the levelling up fund from Westminster will enable great investment and changes within Llangollen Rural. Anglo Welsh plan to relocate the boat yard but there are concerns that the welfare of residents is not paramount in the plans, so I am trying to ensure that we are not forgotten.

The plans for the multi user path between Trevor and Llangollen are still under consultation, with discussions taking place with landowners and Denbighshire C.C. It is hoped that the plan for the J.C.Edwards wall will move forward in the near future with a seating area and notice board in place. I will ensure that you are kept up to date with both of these projects.

In terms of traffic, myself and numerous others are trying to get assistance with the re-opening of the road at Newbridge, as the closure is causing knock on effects throughout the locality, especially when the A483 at Chirk is closed for repairs. On the subject of traffic, discussions are taking place regarding the possibility of a speed camera by the Aussie Rooster. Again you will be notified on any progress.

I would ask residents to bear in mind the problems that refuse wagons are having in certain areas due to cars being parked awkwardly, and also bins being left in positions that make it difficult for these wagons to manoeuvre. Subsequently, on occasions, bins aren't being emptied and complaints ensue. It's not always the fault of the refuse collectors.

Christmas is fast approaching and I wish everyone a safe and happy time. Let's hope the New Year will bring cheer to all.

#### **Crime Trends**

Over the last couple of months, the Eastern District has seen a number of burglaries taking place, whereby offenders seem to be targeting high-powered motor vehicles, these are known as 'car-key burglaries'. We have also seen an increase of forced entry to sheds, whereby high valued items have been stolen. Our dedicated Burglary Team work closely with neighbouring forces as these crime trends are often being committed by offenders who travel between different force areas.

Additionally, we have also seen a spate of number plates being stolen from motor vehicles; and unfortunately offenders will often use these to place onto stolen vehicles to be further used in crime.

We are asking residents to remain vigilant, consider their home security measures and keep a check on their neighbours who may be more vulnerable.

Please always report any suspicious activity to us.

Our Neighbourhood Policing Team have been holding regular 'police surgeries', whereby members of the community can take the opportunity to meet their local PCSO's, to raise any concerns and chat about any issues. ## **Recipe for Bara Brith**

Ingredients:


300g / 11 oz. mixed fruit, 350g / 12 oz. self-raising flour 200g / 7 oz. light muscovado sugar, 2 tsp mixed spice, Zest and juice of 1 orange



1 large egg, beaten, 250ml / 9 fl oz. hot black tea, 50g / 2 oz. soft butter **Method:** 

- 1. Tip fruit into a bowl with the sugar, orange zest and juice. Pour over the tea, stir together and leave to soak overnight.
- 2. Heat oven to Gas 3 / 1700C.
- 3. Grease and line the base and side of a large loaf tin with baking parchment.
- 4. Tip the flour and spice into a bowl and beat in the fruit and soaked liquid. Add the egg followed by the butter. Beat until well mixed batter.
- 5. Put into tin and bake for 1.5 hours until cooked.
- 6. Leave in tin for 10 mins then remove and leave to go cold.



## **Our Picturesque Landscape Project**

Kate Thomson

The Project is a 5 year National Lottery Heritage funded partnership project which centres on the landscape of the Dee Valley, the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct and the World Heritage Site. It takes the theme of inspirational journeys that continue to be a feature of the area which is cut by the canal, the Aqueduct and the River Dee. Visitors have drawn inspiration from this beautiful valley since the 18th century and continue to do so.

We are starting important woodland management work around the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct during the autumn and winter. Some of the trees will be removed, following careful consideration, resulting in a more varied age structure benefitting the woodland, wildlife and people as discrete views will be opened across the World Heritage Site. The work involves coppicing, selective thinning and the felling of unstable stems close to pathways. The autumn and winter months are an ideal time to undertake active woodland management work. This work has been agreed with the Community Councils, Canal and Rivers Trust and Natural Resources Wales.

There are some volunteering opportunities if you would like to learn some of these skills, please email our.picturesque.landscape@denbighshire.gov.uk for more information.

Please note: sections of the pathways will remain open but Marshalls will be in place for your safety, for the duration of the woodland operations.

#### **Clinker Path**

The Clinker Path has had a new top dressing of stone and further drainage recently. We have finally installed the new iron bench at the end of the path by the canal. Some interpretation of the Clinker is due to go in over the winter.

## Picturesque Bus service

We have launched a new bus service in the Dee Valley to provide access to some of the key destinations in this beautiful and historic landscape. The Dee Valley Picturesque Bus service is a circular route which has run every Saturday from May until October 2021, linking Llangollen and the surrounding villages to popular local attractions including Pontcysyllte Aqueduct, Horseshoe Falls, Valle Crucis Abbey, Plas Newydd House and the Horseshoe Pass. The service enables people to visit these locations without the need of a car and reduces the need for parking spaces. It makes it easier for those without their own vehicle to access



places, and helps to reduce congestion.

The service provides both visitors and local residents the opportunity to explore the wider area. The service is funded from The National Lottery Heritage Fund in Wales, and delivered in partnership by Denbighshire County Council and the Our Picturesque Landscape project.

The Bus Service 199 will operate on Saturdays only again in 2022 from May to October.




# Froncysyllte CP School
