



#### **Canal Workforce Update**

Our taskforce has been very busy over the last few weeks tackling the vegetation around the aqueduct. The steps down from the canal have had the loose stones removed as they were turning into a hazard, with the steps becoming slippery. The path from the aqueduct up to the road has had the vegetation cut back as it was encroaching across the path. This is something that we will have to tackle again in the coming months as new growth in spring will come back with a vengeance!

The 'dead end' by the (closed off) Plaskynaston bridge has been dredged manually and has proved to be an ideal way of attracting ducks back to the area. The sunken logs and branches that end up there have been removed along with floating debris and litter. At the other end of the aqueduct (before the closure) we managed to repair one of the

wooden fences that follows the steps underneath. The wood is rotten in places and we are hoping to do some major repairs in the spring, by replacing the fences altogether. If you have any spare time and would like to join the Towpath Taskforce, we meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of each month at the grey shed near the basin, from 10am until 3pm.

#### **County Councillor's Update**

It is a New Year and on a health note hopefully things will continue to improve in relation to Covid.

With winter hopefully slowly leaving us we can look forward to some warmer weather, but as we know, in our area this brings its own problems in terms of visitors to the World Heritage Centre.

I have had countless meetings over the last few months with various officials from the Canal & River Trust and Wrexham Council, to try and ease the problems that we encounter in Trevor and Fron. Whilst they all appear to sympathise with the traffic problems we have, it remains to be seen whether worthwhile actions will be implemented. Please notify me of any concerns you encounter over the coming months. The closure of the Newbridge road has caused numerous problems of late, but hopefully in the near future there will be some good news, and although problems will not disappear overnight there should be light at the end of the tunnel.

The parking restrictions by the Aussie Rooster should be in place shortly. I continue to pester Wrexham Council and I am assured that we are almost there, but bureaucracy can sometimes appear to be slow moving.

Discussions are still ongoing in terms of the Multi-User track to Llangollen and also the JC Edwards wall. I will keep you informed of progress.

In a short time details should emerge of the plans on how the levelling up fund money will be spent. Again you will be kept informed.

#### Apple & spice tea cake recipe

#### Ingredients:

175g butter / 3 large eggs / 175g light Muscovado sugar / 1 eating apple / 1 tsp. vanilla essence / 85g ground almonds / 200g dried mixed fruit / 1 tsp. cinnamon / 175g plain flour / 1 tsp. baking powder / half tsp. nutmeg / 1 tbsp. of marmalade or

apricot jam
Method:

Heat oven to 180C/Fan 160C/Gas 4

Butter a 2lb loaf tin and line with baking paper or a loaf tin liner.

Beat together the butter and sugar until pale and creamy. Beat in eggs, one at a time. Grate the apple and mix into the butter with the vanilla, dried fruit and ground almonds.

Mix baking powder, flour, spices and a pinch of salt. Fold into the batter.

Spoon mixture into the tin and level the top.

Bake for 45 mins then turn oven down to 140C/Fan 120C/Gas 1. Cover with cake foil for another 45 mins. Cool in tin. To finish, melt marmalade/ jam in a pan. Sieve to remove lumps. Brush over the cake to glaze top. Freezable for up to 1 month.

#### **Crime Trends**

Following an emerging trend of thefts of caravans across the district, we are advising owners to review their security measures, remain vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour by using 101 or the live webchat. However, if a crime is believed to be in progress please contact NWP using the emergency 999 number.

We are encouraging owners to register their caravans on the Central Registration & Identification Scheme (CRiS). They have a database for stolen caravans and offer security packages including RFID chips which can be activated, should a caravan be stolen. A small fee may apply. #### 'North Wales Talking' Survey

During the start of February, Neighbourhood Policing Teams have been visiting local residents to complete short surveys about what it is like to live in their area and what issues matter most to them and their community.

North Wales Talking is a major initiative being launched by North Wales Police and is a key priority of our Neighbourhood Policing Teams. It aims to understand the crime and disorder concerns of local communities in North Wales. The feedback will help us and partner agencies understand areas of improvements and to prioritise policing activity.

The surveys were well received and it was great to talk to residents and listen to their feedback.

#### E-Scooters

Since Christmas we have seen an increase of the use of e-scooters being ridden in an antisocial manner. We continue to challenge any individuals riding e-scooters and have been advising parents about the current law regarding them. E-scooters are classed as a motor vehicle and must comply with various pieces of Road Traffic Legislation. This includes driving with a licence, insurance and the requirement for valid vehicle tax. However, it is not currently possible to get appropriate insurance for privately owned e-scooters, meaning it is illegal to use them on a road or public spaces in North Wales.



Firstly, if you have friends or family buried in the churchyard, then please try to visit to tidy the immediate area of their graves.

#### **Our Picturesque Landscape Project**

The Project is a 5-year National Lottery Heritage Funded partnership project, which centres on the landscape of the Dee Valley, the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct and the World Heritage Site.

#### Jeffrey's Wood at Pontcysyllte

The area to the north of the aqueduct was open land in 1870 but is now dense woodland. This woodland had not been managed for many years and so has been thinned through coppicing during this winter period. This helps to open up the woodland floor, allowing sunlight in and flowers to thrive and the existing trees to grow more healthily. It also allows an uneven age structure and wider variety of trees, which is good for the overall health of the woodland and biodiversity, as well as revealing some views.

Phase 1 of the works started in October 2021 with thinning work in Jeffrey's wood. A second week focused on the old hedgerow alongside the steps down to the river from the basin, and on the other side of the aqueduct arches. In a few years the coppiced trees can be re-laid as a hedge, as it would originally have been.

During February 2022, part of the line of trees will be laid as a hedge and the gaps filled with a mix of hedgerow tree species such as hawthorn and hazel, as part of a planting scheme. These trees will be allowed to grow for a few years, before being ready to be laid as a hedge on either side of the pillars to replicate the hedgerow from the 1800's.

Volunteer days were held in November at Pontcysyllte to do some coppicing. Volunteers cut back trees, used 'tree poppers' to relocate coppiced trees that were growing in the wrong place and replanted them in the line of the hedgerow. The idea is that they will grow alongside the coppiced stumps.

#### Local History - Froncysyllte 1890's

A battle raged between local pubs and the Temperance movement in Llangollen Rural over a hundred years ago. Here is some Fron history; a future issue will cover a similar story in Trevor. In the 1890s, there was a "Vron Drinking Club". In April 1897, the Llangollen Advertiser reported that two Vron men had been found guilty of committing an affray. P.C. Harris stated he had seen the men "stripped and fighting outside the Vron Drinking Club". The newspaper headline for the news item was "The Vron Club Again", there having been several reports of arrests in 1897 and 1898. The Llangollen Licensing Magistrates were told in September 1898 that almost all the cases of Sunday drunkenness were from Vron, where a drinking club existed. The pubs in Wales were closed on Sundays.

By 1899 the Temperance Movement was fighting locally to combat the spread of alcohol. The Independent Order of Good Templars (I.O.G.T.) was active in Vron and campaigned for prohibition. It strove to provide social facilities that served non-alcoholic beverages, promoted education, self-help, and supported decent working conditions.

On 17th March 1899, The Llangollen Advertiser reported that the I.O.G.T had announced that, "The members of the "Rising Sun" Lodge of Good Templars at Vron removed their lodge room to premises to be known as "Vron Temperance Hall", recently used for an entirely different purpose and locally known as "The Vron Drinking Club".

In LRCC's Community News (Summer 2012), an article on the 1911 Vron census by Emrys Roberts confirms the existence of a Temperance Hall in the village, presumably the same hall discussed above. So where was the Temperance Hall? The 1939 census for Fron records that as there was a Temperance House, occupied by John James, Louisa James and John Evans. It was located between "The Old Post Office" and 1 Cross Street Terrace. It is possible that this was the same building.


