### A World Class Attraction On Our Doorstep

10 years ago, on the 27<sup>th</sup> June in Seville, the 33<sup>rd</sup> session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee examined the nomination of the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct and Canal and inscribed the property on the World Heritage List.

Our site is certainly special, an 11 mile testament to the engineers of the time, and exemplified new approaches to engineering developed during the industrial revolution and used subsequently in waterway, railway and road construction throughout the World.

We join the collection of 1092 World Heritage Sites in the World. We are one of the 31 in the UK and one of the 3 in Wales.

To celebrate this 10 year Anniversary there are a range of activities happening during this year. It has been a great example of partnership working with representatives from Denbighshire County Council, Wrexham County Borough Council, the Canal & River Trust and Techniquest Glyndŵr.



On the 27<sup>th</sup> June, the anniversary of the inscription, there was a canal trip organised for some of those involved during the initial inscription process as well as those who are involved in managing the site today. A World Heritage Site Fun Day was held in Trevor on the 29<sup>th</sup> June. It was a great day involving the local community with stalls and activities leading up to the event including making very striking banners and bunting, as well as a piece of dance being commissioned and performed at the event.



We had a presence at the Llangollen International Eisteddfod which was very colourful and generated a lot of interest. It was a really useful way of promoting that the site is 11 miles long and not just focused around the Aqueduct.



Lots more activities are planned for the rest of the year and will culminate with the World Heritage UK Conference in October at the Pavilion in Llangollen.

There will be an exhibition of all of the artwork that has been produced by the various groups throughout this year at Ty Pâwb in Wrexham in November and on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> there will be a concert featuring music and poetry that has been composed taking inspiration from the canal and the aqueduct.





### **Our Picturesque Landscape Heritage Lottery Funded Project**

We have many projects we are delivering over the next 4 years in the Dee Valley and an interesting one is around improving the view. Every year a survey is taken of selected recognised 'key views' within the World Heritage Site to monitor them. Over time naturally things change and vegetation grows. Sometimes this has a positive benefit offering a greener outlook and wonderful wildlife benefits but in some places this growth needs to be managed carefully in order to preserve these views. This work is ongoing during the lifetime of the project and we always mitigate any losses by planting trees in other locations within the project area such as by the new Clinker path in Trevor.

We will be surveying the invasive species which

are taking over along the River Dee in September with a view to focusing our clearance efforts of Himalayan Balsam along the river banks. This non-native species is outcompeting with all the native plants and has a big impact on our wildlife and is also very easily spread. Over the coming months we have an exciting opportunity to repair some of the dry stone

walling and preserve it for the future in The Dell at Plas Newydd, Llangollen. The Dell comprises of the Ladies of Llangollen naturalist garden. ### Cefn Mawr Neighbourhood Policing Team.

Over recent months the Neighbourhood Policing team have been made aware of the increase in Antisocial behaviour such as loud noise, damage to property etc in your local area. In response to this there has been a marked increase in the amount of officers in the area leading to a number of positive stop searches and also a higher level of engagement with the youths themselves to try and prevent this happening in the future.

Another issue we are aware of in the area, particularly in the evenings, is the roads being used like racetracks by vehicles causing a nuisance for local residents. Again, the Neighbourhood Policing Team are taking steps to counter this problem. Of note the Roads Policing Unit have been assisting in the area with patrols in both marked and unmarked vehicles to try and catch these individuals at the time. Also the Neighbourhood officers have been liaising with other agencies in the area to try and come up with a long term plan as this is not the first time this area has had this issue.

On a lighter note in recent weeks there have been some great events in the area including Under the Arches. The event looked like an excellent one and went off without a hitch which is a huge credit to the organisers....we look forward to next year!

I have received enquiries about a couple of matters relating to the A5 in Fron.

The crossing outside Fron Pizza - a resident has expressed concern about the timing of the light sequence when someone wants to cross. I have raised this issue with the North Mid Wales Trunk Road Agent (NMWTRA) who act as agents for the Welsh Government and I await a reply.

Parking in the lay-bys near the Lime Kilns and AN Richards - the lay-bys are the responsibility of the North Mid Wales Trunk Road Agent (NMWTRA) but parking enforcement is carried out, on their behalf, by Wrexham Council. Some residents seem unaware the both lay-bys have strict limits on the time you can park there for free, so it is worth checking the signs if you use the lay-bys.

### Dinas Bran news..... PUPILS CELEBRATE PLATINUM STATUS

Pupils at Ysgol Dinas Brân have proven their green credentials after being awarded a top eco award. Ysgol Dinas Brân have been awarded the prestigious Platinum Flag Award after previously gaining three Green Flag Awards thanks to the environmental education programme, Eco-Schools.

Eco-Schools is an international programme run in Wales by environmental charity, Keep Wales Tidy and funded by the Welsh Government. Over 90% of schools in Wales are registered on the programme.

The Eco-Schools programme inspires and empowers pupils to be leaders of change in their community, helping them learn about sustainable living and global citizenship while giving them the information and support they need to make changes that will benefit their school, local environment and wider community, such as reducing waste, energy consumption, transport, biodiversity, healthy living and litter issues.

As part of their Eco-Schools Platinum assessment, Ysgol Dinas Brân organised a Go Green Day for its Year 7 students, which was led by the school's Student Council. Ysgol Dinas Brân involved their local Counsellor Robin Lovelock, the AM Ken Skates and MP Susan Elan Jones in the project. The school secured a Rural Futures Lotto grant working with Mark Gahan from a local development agency Severn Wye to get the Inter-Climate Network to run workshops on sustainability and single use plastics.

Ysgol Dinas Brân is a British Council International School Award holder so to tackle a global issue it worked in partnerships with schools in Italy, Germany and Lebanon with students exchanging film messages explaining what they were doing about sustainability. The school has since focused on sustainability as its transition week project with local primary schools participating. The Student Council is working with MP Susan Elan Jones to put a petition to Parliament to stop the use of all non-essential single use plastics in all UK schools. The Student Council has already been successful in working with Denbighshire County Council in stopping the use of Styrofoam in all Denbighshire schools from 2020 onwards.

Andrew Wallis, said:

"This is a fantastic achievement that the students and staff at Ysgol Dinas Brân can be rightly proud of. We have had a very busy year with a number of different student led campaigns and workshops which are having a real impact on our students and the wider community. We as a school body are very excited and motivated to keep campaigning on

environmental issues as some of our students have said we have little choice as There isn't a Planet B "

Catrin Hughes, Education Officer for Keep Wales Tidy said:

"The Platinum Flag is a very impressive achievement and highlights the enthusiasm and commitment that Ysgol Dinas Brân has towards sustainable development. The dedication of the Eco-Committee over many years has been inspirational. I'd like to congratulate and thank all of the pupils and staff involved for their hard work!"

#### Button batteries potential death risk to children

Button batteries "can kill a child" if accidentally swallowed, says the Office for Product Safety and Standards.

The Office urges parents to take extreme caution with children using any electronic devices containing button batteries, and seek immediate medical attention if a child accidentally swallows one.

Don't give them anything to eat or drink, and do not try to make them sick, as this could make the chemical reaction even worse.

### Acrefair and Trevor gas pipe upgrade

I want to inform you of our upcoming gas pipe upgrade work in Acrefair and Trevor. We will start our work on 9<sup>th</sup> September on Llangollen Road and anticipate that our work will finish at the end of November 2019.

We know our work can be disruptive and we appreciate this work may, at times, be inconvenient, but it really is essential to make sure that we keep the gas flowing to homes and businesses in your area and you and your family are safe and warm for generations to come. We have worked closely with Wrexham County Borough Council to keep this disruption to a minimum. To keep the local community, road users and our colleagues safe, a two-way traffic light system will be in use on Llangollen Road throughout our works. The two-way traffic light system will temporarily change to three-way as we pass the junction of Station Road so we can work safely.

There will also be a two-week road closure in place on Tower Hill from both junctions off Llangollen Road. Access to residents will be maintained via Tower Hill by the Towers Nursery and there will be a diversion route in place on the opposite junction towards the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct car park. This diversion will be via Abernant and will be clearly signposted while we're working.

This essential gas pipe investment work is part of our multi-million-pound 30 year gas pipe investment programme across the south west of England and Wales. Old metal gas pipes within 30 metres of buildings are being upgraded to new, long lasting plastic ones. We are spending £1.4 million on this programme every week to keep the gas flowing and make sure your gas network is fit for the future.

We are now into the summer season, a rather wet one to date but the long summer evenings are here for us to enjoy.

Unfortunately I have to start on a negative note and draw residents' attention to the anti-social behaviour which has been taking place in Trevor, both around the estate and on the WHS car park. Although things have improved of late since a regrettable incident in the George Avenue playground, the Police are now fully aware of the problems that exist and action will be taken against those responsible if matters deteriorate. Underneath The Arches went well but there were a few complaints which have been reported back to the organisers for them to take on board for subsequent events.

There have been meetings with WCBC and the Canal and River Trust to try and eliminate some of the issues we have with buses on Gate Road and on the Trevor estate. Discussions have taken place with two local boat tour companies for them to amend their routes and use the official WHS car park for dropping off and pickups. There is going to be a consultation in regard to yellow lines being placed on Gate Road to try and alleviate the long standing parking problems from the A5 down to the Community Centre in Fron.

Discussions are taking place with a view to part of the school playing field at Fron being made available to the community to use.

I would like to thank all those who entered the annual garden competition for doing so and ensuring that this fine tradition continues. I am not privy to the results but I believe the standards were once again high.

From the 9<sup>th</sup> September for approximately 6 weeks a road management programme is in place for work on an existing gas main between Tower Hill and the bottom of Garth Hill by the Aussie Rooster. Patience may be called for on occasions.


