Hello I would like to introduce myself as the new community agent for Garth, Trevor & Fron my name is Jennie Wilson and I am excited to be working in my own area in this new role. The community agent roll is to provide people over 50 with help and advice on services available in the county and help to access them, this is a free and confidential service aimed to improve their quality of life. "The Community Agents Project is delivered by Wrexham County Borough Council, Community Councils and Avow commissioned by Wrexham County Borough Council.

Community Agents work with the over 50s in Wrexham, providing easy access to a wide range of information that will enable them to make informed choices about their present and future needs. The aim is to help older people feel more independent, secure, and cared for, and to have a better quality of life.

Community Agents will support people living in areas of Wrexham, bridging the gap between the local community and the statutory or voluntary organisations and are able to offer help or support.

The scheme works because Agents live close to and in the communities in which they work. Consequently, they know the villages and their people well.

Agents provide an overview of services available in the county and offer help to access them. They help in myriads of other ways too - thus winning the trust of those they help and enabling particularly older people to stay independent for longer.

Community Agents Wrexham have over the last 12 months worked with and visited 304 people to support them to live independently"

Police Matters

Car owners in Flintshire and Wrexham are seeing an increase in Car-Key Burglaries targeting high performance Audis, BMW's and Volkswagen Golf Type R's and GTI's.

Thieves will break into houses looking for car keys. They can also use wires and hooks to try and drag your keys through the letterbox. Keep your keys away from doors and windows, and tucked away out of sight.

Have your vehicles windows etched with its registration number or the last seven digits of the vehicle identification number (VIN). This can put criminals off, as it makes your car more difficult to sell. It also makes it easier for the police identify and/or return your vehicle if it is stolen.

Car key burglaries are often committed by criminals who are working to order and targeting certain types of vehicle, based on demand and value.

If you have cars of different values, please park the higher value car in your garage. If you can't do this, please park the lower value car in front of the higher value car, as the thieves are more likely to target high value cars and will be deterred if they can't easily drive such a car away from the scene.

All vehicle owners should be vigilant with their vehicle security and take

simple crime prevention measures to deter thieves. These include keeping vehicle keys safe and out of sight both in the home and when you're out and about.

Should you note any suspicious activity involving your home or vehicle please call 101 and report it.

County Councillor Diary

It's some time since the last newsletter and my contribution.

On the local side of things I'm sure most people are aware of Sue Jones steping down after many years of great work for our community. In the last few weeks a Community Agent has been appointed and as time progresses I'm sure she will be a recognised figure in the community.

Part of the Monsanto/Flexsys warehouse site is being converted into a car park for visitors to our Aqueduct and hopefully this will ease traffic problems around the immediate vicinity of the canal. It was hoped that it would be ready by the 1st of April but this is now looking unlikely. After representations to Wrexham Council negotiations are taking place to temporarily extend the lease on Reads Yard car park until the new facility is open.

Whilst in that area I would encourage locals to enjoy the new Chapel Tea Rooms on Station Road. A welcome addition to the area's facilities.

Talks are ongoing to review the street lighting along Mill Lane past the warehouse as this area needs improved lighting. I will keep you informed. I made strong representations to the necessary highway department to improve the bad weather treatment of local roads and this has resulted in increased gritting teams in the area.

Exploratory negotiations are in place to purchase a mobile speed awareness box for our use. As stated it would be mobile and could be utilised wherever residents perceive a speed problem. This would indicate to drivers their speed in a given area and hopefully cut down on the speed complaints we have.

There have been instances of fly tipping in the area and the dog fouling continues. This is an area of which we should be proud given the beautiful countryside and every instance of dog fouling and fly tipping detracts from its splendour, I would ask residents to be ever watchful.

These last few months have proved to be quite eventful in the life of Llangollen Rural Council.

You will have noticed that the Newsletter has been missing for a while but has now returned under the stewardship of Cllr Steve Edwards. Many will know that our esteemed Clerk of many years standing, Mrs Sue Jones, has stepped down from her role. Sue was a driving force for this Council and her knowledge and expertise will be sorely missed. In the interim Ms Andrea Evans has stepped into the breach and has proved a valuable asset in these most trying of times. Steps are in hand to appoint a new clerk as soon as possible - see the advert overleaf.

An exciting new development for the community has been the appointment of Jennifer Wilson as our Community Agent. This is a new role for our community and we are confident that Jennifer will be an invaluable asset to us. Other areas within Wrexham County have Agents in place. The vision and set of aims is to improve the health and wellbeing of vulnerable people over 50 and their informal carers. There are many facets to this role but we wish to support and maintain independent living and to reduce the demands on health and social care services amongst other things.

Over time I'm sure Jennifer will acquaint herself with people in the community and install her own agenda which will be of assistance to those most in need. As Jennifer has only just started we need to give her all the help and support to enable her to meet those who need her most which I'm sure we will all do.

Due to increasing numbers of visitors at the Aqueduct and to tie into the end of leases on car parks, provision has been reviewed and is being altered to cater for the increased demand. Planning permission for a new Car Park was approved in December 2017 for the old Warehouse site and the intention was to have this operational by the beginning of the season. Unfortunately this has been delayed and a temporary agreement is being sought to continue to use Read's yard until the new Warehouse car park is open and operational. All car park signage will then be revised to direct people to the Warehouse site car park from whatever direction they are travelling.

The only exception will be for disabled drivers and they will be directed towards the existing car park next to the toilet block.

Appointment of Clerk/Responsible Finance Officer

Overall Responsibilities

The Clerk to the Council will be the Proper Officer of the Council and as such is under a statutory duty to carry out all the functions, and in particular to serve or issue all the notifications required by law of a local authority's Proper Officer.

The Clerk will be totally responsible for ensuring that the instructions of the Council in connection with its function as a Local Authority are carried out.

The Clerk is expected to advise the Council on, and assist in the formation of overall policies to be followed in respect of the Authority's activities and in particular to produce all the information required for making effective decisions and to constructively implement all decisions.

The Clerk will be accountable to the Council for the effective management of all its resources and employees and will report to them as and when required.

The Clerk will also be the Responsible Financial Officer and therefore responsible for all financial records of the Council and the careful administration of its finances.

This position has expected hours of work of up to 16 hours/week.

Attendance is required at the Council Meetings held alternatively in the Garth & Trevor Community Centre and the Froncysyllte Community Centre on the evenings of the first Tuesday of each month, noting there are no such meetings held in January and August months. Other extraordinary meetings may be arranged as necessary throughout the year.


