


Port & Damson Jam

1500g damsons, 200ml water, 1200g sugar and 75ml port

Wash the damsons. Put the fruit into the pan with 200ml water and simmer for 30 mins. Allow the fruit to cool a little then remove the stones. Add the sugar and return to a medium heat until the sugar has dissolved. Turn the heat up until a rolling boil and continue to boil for 15 mins. Test for setting. When setting is achieved take the jam off the heat, add the port and leave to cool a little. Ladle the jam into sterilised jars and label when cold.

Tastes lovely. Port can be added to stewed damsons which can be used in many ways....cheesecake toppings, sponge cake filling or just eaten with yoghurt.

Dog fouling in the Llangollen Rural Community.

Dog fouling has become a huge problem within the area of Llangollen Rural as it has in many other places around the county

Some of the worst affected areas are Trevor estate where the foot paths are covered in dog waste. The old railway walk where some people think they don't need to pick up after their dogs, along the canal and Bryn Zion field (next to the car park by the toilets at Trevor basin.)

"Don't Be Foul - Pick up the Poo" continues to be the County Council's message to those irresponsible dog owners who are still allowing their dogs to foul without picking it up.

Kingdom security has taken responsibility for patrolling the areas and issuing the fixed penalty notices to offenders but we all need to do our bit by ensuring our dog waste is collected and taken home or disposed of in waste bins.

Cllr David A. Bithell, Lead Member for Environment and Transport, said:

"Dog fouling continues to blight our communities and is something members of the public feel very strongly about. Kingdom Security has been paying particular attention to this offence and the figures show for themselves the success they are having. They are tackling offenders across the county borough and I thank members of the public for continuing to report the matter."

Reports to the Environment Department of dog fouling has increased since the beginning of this year and incidences of dog fouling can be reported via email to contact-us@wrexham.gov.uk. Names of offenders if known and times of incidences can be reported in confidence.







POLICE MATTERS

I have received numerous reports and complaints about inconsiderate parking of vehicles in some areas of Llangollen Rural, whilst I am aware that the geography of some areas and the number of vehicles owned by residents exceeds the possible parking spaces ,vehicles parked on pavements are a potentially dangerous street obstruction which can force pedestrians to walk along the road to bypass those vehicles. This is especially problematic for pedestrians who are blind or visually impaired and may not see oncoming traffic, as well as wheelchair users, people with pushchairs and older people.

Please have consideration for pedestrians and other road users when parking including parking near junctions and corners where visibility is limited. The situation is not helped by any vehicles that are abandoned or not road legal which can be reported to Wrexham Council or the DVLA online or to North Wales Police if necessary. I am aware of a car park in the local area which recently had six or seven vehicles clamped by the DVLA for being untaxed, the removal of which will free up parking spaces for others.

Speed of vehicles and manner of driving in certain areas of the ward also continues to be identified as a problem and speed checks will continue in the ward. Over the past few months in the Wrexham area there has numerous thefts from vehicles many of which were unlocked, despite campaigns and publicity regarding vehicle security. North Wales Police initiatives are still finding many vehicles unlocked and insecure and valuables in plain view. Insurance companies will often not pay out if 'reasonable precautions' have not been taken which also apples to household and other policies.

Lastly house to house traders. We get numerous calls concerned about traders calling door to door selling produce such as fish. Bona fide traders should be registered by their local council and supply the name they trade under and provide a receipt for goods sold. If in doubt you can contact Trading Standards or the Police.

Well I am now into my third month and I must admit it's been guite an eye opener for me.

I have attended an endless stream of courses all designed to acquaint me with the workings of being a County Councillor.

On the works side I have held meetings with Street Scene and requested their assistance in addressing some of the problems some of you have raised. The road markings in Fron are being looked at and hopefully will be completed shortly. A rubbish bin is being situated at the entrance to the Canal from the old warehouse side.

A large bone of contention within the area is of course parking in Trevor by visitors to the Aqueduct. Discussions are ongoing and a short term solution is the opening of the field for car parking. Hopefully this will alleviate the problem over the summer months and could provide income for local groups.

While on the subject of parking I know that Fron has similar problems around the basin with coaches parking for long periods and causing problems for residents. Again this is a subject that I have brought to the attention of Street Scene and with the Lead Member, David Bithell. I am actively pursuing all the parking issues we have and I will report to you on further updates when they become available.

Work in progress and still waiting on Wrexham County Borough Council to resolve the issues on:

Trevor Railway line trees and bushes

Various areas that require new road markings Methodist Hill in Fron

Anti-social neighbour behaviour on Heol Penderyst / Charles Avenue

Numerous parking and traffic problems in the ward

The new litter / dog fouling bin at the entrance to the canal towpath behind the warehouses

A **Skip Day** has been arranged again this year (for Council tenants only), on the 20th September.

Opening of the newly refurbished play area in Garth.

After a £45,000 park revamp, the new play area in Garth has been officially opened with a community event.

The upgrades were paid for by Llangollen Rural Community Council and a significant Waste Recycling Environment (WREN) grant which allowed a nest swing, boulders, a zip wire, a multiuse goal end, a spinning dish, cradle swings, basket swings, a tunnel and climbing mound, a multi user seesaw, picnic benches and seating installed.

The children and residents from Garth and Trevor have given the park their seal of approval after attending the 'Picnic in the Park' with refreshments being served by the Aqueduct Community Association.

The Chairman of Llangollen Rural Community Council Councillor Darrell Wright said "I would like to thank everyone who has been involved, especially to the teachers and pupils of Garth School, Councillor's Mark Valentine and Sue Kempster, to Mr Pat Jeffares, our Clerk Sue Jones and finally to the whole community for supporting this project."

The play area was opened by our former County Councillor Mr Pat Jeffares who said "It was so nice to see the children from Garth so excited as they tried out all the new play equipment, especially the zip wire".

WREN, is a not for profit business which awards grants to community projects from funds donated by FCC Environment to the Landfill Communities Fund.

Richard Smith, WREN grant manager, said: "The applicants submitted a good application which has resulted in WREN funding a new play area in Garth.

The local advisory panel were impressed with the level of consultation which showed that the play area will be well used and that local people support the project'."
