Sticky Ginger Bread

40g Margarine 90g Treacle 40g Granulated sugar ½ Teaspoon vinegar 1 egg 7 inch square tin 10ozs Plain flour 1 Level teaspoon Bi Carb 2 Level teaspoons ground ginger 1 Level teaspoon cinnamon 1 ½ gill milk (1 gill = ¼pint)

Method

Add the treacle, margarine, sugar and milk into a pan on a low heat and melt, then leave to cool. Sift the flour, Bi Carb, ginger, and cinnamon into a bowl. Make a well in the centre and pour mixture from the pan, add eggs, milk and vinegar into the flour and stir all together well, then pour into a papered and greased tin. Cook on gas mark 3 (165 - 170c) for 1½ hours or until it feels spongy to the touch.



Police Matters

Over the last few months Wrexham County has suffered from a spate of car key burglaries generally targeting prestige and high performance vehicles but any vehicle may be at risk if basic common sense precautions are not taken. North Wales Police are taking steps to counter this current problem but need members of the public to be alert to risks and ensure vehicles and properties are kept locked and secure and that car keys and valuables are not on display.

At this time of year there can also be an increase in distraction burglaries and rogue trader incidents with the dark nights closing in and the weather getting colder. Any persons soliciting work door to door should be treated with caution, especially if they inform you work needs to be done on your property such as roof repairs, gutter clearing or trees cutting back. Do not allow unknown persons into your property including representatives of utility companies or the Council or Police if you are not sure of their credentials or a valid appointment has not been made. Any work that needs to be done is best undertaken after speaking to family or friends for recommendation of trusted tradesmen.

This time of year there is also a noticeable increase in cars left with engines running unattended, or even with small children in the car, outside shops and the like on cold mornings. Apart from being an offence, this action can have much more serious consequences; vehicles are regularly reported stolen opportunistically when keys have been left in the ignition. In regard to the dark nights please be mindful of bicycles without lights, the busy roads can be dangerous enough for cyclists with traffic and potholes without the added danger of not being easily seen.
