Local Interest goes Nationwide

Following on from Laurence Llewelyn-Bowen's "Hidden Houses of Wales" that featured Trevor Hall. The house's connection with J C Edwards, the canal and railway were explored in the programme, as were local names, which leads me on to an article that appeared in "The cefn chronicle" in 1950. I hope you find it interesting. The article, a series of several, was written by a Mr J Watkin Ellis and entitled: Points of Local Interest.

"Trevor Hall is a large brick mansion, situated on rising ground on the north side of the Wrexham to Llangollen road. It was once the residence of John Trevor, later Bishop of St. Asaph, who in the year 1346 caused a strong bridge to be built over the Dee at Llangollen, which bridge is accounted one of the seven wonders of Wales. "Pennant" states that Trevor Hall passed into the family of the Lloyds and has continued in that family to the present time. The last possessor was a lady of the name of Thomas, deceased in the last year, and leaving a son to inherit, although at present he does not occupy the premises. The house is roomy and substantial, and is pleasantly situated.

"Near the house is a "Chapel of Ease", enjoying Queen Anne's bounty, in which an English service is performed on the first Sunday in each month.

"In a rocky cliff in the neighbourhood of the hall is a cavern of some extent, in which I was informed were to be found some petrified bones of wolves, foxes and other wild animals. After exploring the cavern I failed to find vestiges of any such relics. I brought away, however, some specimens of stalactites of curious forms and various incrustations which may have been mistaken by some for petrified bony substances.

"This craggy ridge appears to be the commencement of that wonderful range of limestone called the Eglwyseg Rocks.

(Note-Before the use of whetstone for sharpening scythes, wooden bats, dipped first of all in grease and afterwards in fine sand were used. Sand obtained from these rocks was the best obtainable and much sought after. I came across two of these wooden bats for sale in a shop at Trawsfynydd not long ago).

"On the roadside between, Trevor Hall and Bron Heulog, is a small farmhouse called Plas Eva or Evan. I notice it only as marking the spot, where formerly was a cemetery, retaining the appellation of 'Mynwent y Quacer,' or Quaker's Burying Ground. It is on the south side of the house and in cutting the canal the earth from the excavation was thrown upon the old graves and the inscribed stones that lay upon the surface.

"Opposite the north side of the same house, a few years ago as some labourers were working in the limestone quarries, they discovered a pot, filled with gold coins. The find was kept a secret and one of the party disposed of the coins at Chester, as old gold. Later on an enquiry was instituted, but only one gold piece and a part of the earthen vessel, which one of the men had kept as a curiosity, was recovered. They are now, I am informed in the possession of Lady Clive.

"About a mile nearer the castle (Castell Dinas Bran) stands a recently erected mansion, called Bron Heulog—only remarkable for the narrowness of its Windows."

Lemon & Orange Cake

Ingredients:	Svrup:	lcing:
ingreateris.	Oylup.	icing.

1 orange, 2 lemons 4 oz caster sugar 2 tbsp of fresh orange juice

6 oz self-raising flour juice of two lemons 4 oz icing sugar

6 oz margarine Orange segments and orange rind to decorate.

5 oz caster sugar

3 medium eggs

Preheat the oven to 160 C/325 F gas mark 3. Grease and flour a 1 kg/2 lb non-stick loaf tin. Finely grate the rind of one lemon and the orange. Sift the flour into a bowl and add the sugar, margarine, eggs and rind. Beat with a wooden spoon for 1-2 minutes until the mixture is light and fluffy. Pour the mixture into the tin and bake for 1 hour 15 minutes. Leave the cake to stand for a few minutes then turn out on to a wire rack.

To make the syrup, place the caster sugar in a pan along with the juice from the two lemons. Heat gently until the sugar has dissolved – taking care not to burn. Bring to the boil stirring occasionally and boil for about 10 seconds. Return the sponge to the tin and pour over the syrup. Leave the cake in the tin until cold.

Make the icing by adding enough orange juice to the icing sugar to create a slightly runny consistency. Turn the cake out of the tin and cover with the icing. Decorate with orange segments and slivers of orange rind.



Garth C.P. School News

The Ash Cloud could not dampen my excitement at making new friends and colleagues in Germany. As part of our International links and Citizenship Curriculum, I visited a partner school in Schwabish Hall in the Baden Wuttenberg area of Germany in April. My return was delayed as a result of the "ash cloud", and it was impossible to get a flight back until mid May, so I had no option but to take five trains across Europe in order to return to school, where a mountain of paperwork was waiting for me. However, all this did not spoil the experiences gained whilst over in Grandschule Kreusacker.

Whilst there, I taught Language and Geography and was introduced to the German education system. It was strange to attend a primary school where there were no pupils under six years of age and I quickly realised that the little ones add a very special dimension to a school. Their excited enthusiasm and eagerness to learn through play and hands —on activities echoes around the school here in Garth and this made me feel a great loss when I was in the school in Germany. However, the pupils were very friendly in Grandschule Kreusacker, showing respect when I taught them. They were able and enthusiastic in all their activities and the school had a friendly, family atmosphere similar to the atmosphere here in Garth. This bodes well for our partnership. I enjoyed teaching in four different classes and they thoroughly enjoyed learning about Wales and our area. They enjoyed reading the letters my pupils had written and they responded.

We now aim to continue the link and develop a partnership. We aim to exchange resources and information, to use video conferencing and e-mail facilities to correspond and to arrange an exchange in the future. The partnership was all made possible through the hard work of CILT Cymru and the funding and Support of The British Council. Funding for supply was awarded by WAG.Our pupils were invited to the launch of a "children's rights" Website and phone-in "MEIC" at Glyndwr University on Friday. These commitments have been given by Wrexham County Borough Council to Cllr. Pat Jeffares and the Clerk Sue Jones during their monthly Ward visits. I would like to thank Pat and Sue for their hard work and tenacity, as securing funds for road repairs are hard fought during these difficult economic times.

Police Matters

Although Llangollen Rural is still a relatively low crime area I would like to remind you all to avoid becoming complacent in regard to basic security and common sense precautions. Doors are best locked even when at home and unknown visitors should not be admitted without confirmed identification. In regard to reduce the risk of criminal damage to your property we would offer the following advice:-

- If you have off road parking, use it especially if specified on your insurance policy.
- Avoid parking vehicles near to alleyways where possible.
- Consider setting up or joining a neighbourhood/premises watch scheme.
- Remove valuables from display in vehicles.
- Remove articles from display in forecourts that can be easily removed and thrown.
- Don't leave rubbish or flammable materials close to your property if possible.
- Retract or detach aerials and mirrors the most common damage is mirrors kicked off vehicles.
- Consider investing in CCTV to monitor your premises and property.
- Please ensure that vessels capable of storing any means of fuel are locked and kept secure at all times - we are currently experiencing a dramatic rise in thefts of fuel due to increasing fuel prices.
