The current contract for this service expires on the 31st March 2017 and the work currently being undertaken is for a contract award to deliver continuation and stability of this service from the 1st April 2017.

As the Community Council are aware I have had meetings with Wendy Cappell Canal & Rivers Trust and Allan Forest Wrexham Country Borough Council during the last two months about the Coach Parking in Fron Basin. After a lot of discussion hey are now having talks with the Boat and Coach operators and also speaking to the local land owners and I hope that we will have everything in place for the start of the new season. I'm prepared to work with the new County Councillor if required on this matter.

As there is an election this year here is a brief resume of the duties of a Community Councillor:

The Council comprises 10 Councillors and a Clerk with all communities represented. The AGM is held annually prior to the May meeting when officers are elected together with representatives to outside bodies. There are three sub-committees, a Finance committee, a Playground committee and a Noddfa Cemetery committee. (The Council inherited the cemetery when Noddfa chapel in Garth closed and is responsible for its management.)

Meetings of the Council are held on the first Tuesday of each month (except for August and January) alternately at Fron and Trevor Community Centres. Notices are posted prior to each meeting detailing the location and time. Members of the public are allowed to attend but are not allowed to speak except by permission of the Chairman.

The Clerk, who is salaried, is responsible for producing the minutes and agenda for each meeting and in our case is the Responsible Finance Officer with responsibility for the annual audit of the accounts.

At our monthly meetings we -

- a) Obtain a report from the police on activity in the area for the previous month and have the opportunity to report to them any concerns.
- b) Receive updates to the outstanding work log (potholes that need filling, hedges that need cutting, overgrown paths, etc.) that required attention.
- c) Have the opportunity to report matters that need to be added to the work log.
- d) Any planning application in our area to Wrexham County Borough Council is passed to the Council for any observation that we may have on it.
- e) Each month considerable correspondence is received by our Clerk and this is reviewed at our meetings and is then circulated for further consideration.
- f) Any matters relating to footpaths and roadways are reviewed including the annual contract for the maintenance of some of the footpaths for which we are responsible.
- g)We maintain a project fund for each community so that when a request is received for funding we will consider it.
- h) As a Council we are the owners of Noddfa cemetery in Garth and are responsible for its upkeep. Annually we conduct a risk assessment of the monuments.
- i) At each meeting our Clerk, who is our Responsible Finance Officer, provides a financial statement detailing the receipts, pledges and payments for the previous month together with the current bank balance. The Clerk also supervises the annual internal and external audits with the support of the Finance sub-Committee.
- j)Periodically we produce a newsletter, organise a Garden competition, donate funding to local organisations and conduct a risk assessment of our property in the area.

Roberts & Maginnis Brickworks

Continued.....

Wrexham Advertiser 17th December 1881 – A meeting of gentlemen interested in the Garth Brick & Tile Works was held at the Wynnstay Arms, Oswestry last week with a view to forming a limited company for the purpose of carrying on the works.



The outcome of that meeting resulted in Mr. Shelmerdine's father in law Mr Neil advancing the company a further £2,000 to assist on developing the works; presumably to increase the work's competitive capability. Shelmerdine also persuaded Mason to accept £1,500 to become a sleeping partner in the company and he also paid off the outstanding mortgage, but in order to achieve this he pledged the credit of the firm to such an extent that the company couldn't balance its books and went bust in March 1882. But due unfortunately to some awkward technicalities, it was Charles Mason who found himself legally responsible for debts of £2,000 on the company's behalf, and the stress on his mind took its toll, Mason became for a long time insane and eventually regained enough of his reason to take on less demanding work as an engine driver (whether on the railways or the operator of a stationary steam engine is not specified). When fully recovered he eventually took up the position as manager of the Vron Works at Coedpoeth in 1889.

The works eventually fell into the hands of Messrs Roberts & Maginnis-when is not clear, but some say they held it by 1885. Perhaps they acquired after the 1882 bankruptcy. John F Maginnis lived at Derwen Hall, Garth and was the company's financial manager, whilst Roberts was the technical operator.

By the outbreak of the First World War the new company had abandoned the production of building bricks in favour of the manufacture of silica bricks for the steel industry; Maginnis having practical connections with the Colville Steelworks in Glasgow. The company also began producing ganister, a plastic cement substance used to mould the channels into which molten iron was tapped from steel furnaces. This substance was an amalgam of water, silica, sandstone, broken silica, brick fragments and fireclay which the company imported from Shropshire. The silica stone was mined from two sources, one

being a mine in the hills which was reached by horse and cart, and in the early 20th century by an aerial ropeway system. The other source was a level mine which ran into the hillside directly at the back of the works and which was worked by donkeys pulling tubs. This led to the brickworks earning the nickname of The Donkey Works, which lasted in local parlance long after the donkeys had ceased. From the 1930's onwards the stone was brought in from nearby Minera as well as from other Welsh counties.

By 1922 the company was classifying themselves as the "Welsh Silica Brick & Ganister Works".

There was a popular misconception that the works was the property of JC Edwards Ltd during the 1920's and 40's. However the only connection to the JC Edwards Ltd was that the Garth Works leased part of their lands from J C E and had no other involvement with them whatsoever.

The 1960's saw some new practices in Garth. The kilns were converted to oil firing and the method of shipping out the products was also changed. At that time there was much industrial unrest within British Railways, and the problems caused to all the local industries became quite serious; to such an extent that the branch line which crossed the Ruabon to Llangollen road into the factory was abandoned and road transportation was used thereafter; to the unexpected benefit of the company, as they not only realised a financial saving but gained greater flexibility over the movement of materials.

The works eventually shut in 1979 - a victim of the recession in the steel industry.

In the 1980's all the land was sold. Then in 2001 the old brickworks land was re-sold to Watkin Jones and they applied to Wrexham County Borough Council to build forty houses. Today the old brickworks is a housing estate and it's called The Oaks.







Almond Cake with Florentine Topping

607 Butter 6oz Caster Sugar 6oz self-raisina flour 3oz Almonds 3 Eggs

Set the oven to Gas Mark 4 or elec 180c or fan 160c

Sift the sugar and flour into a bowl, beat the butter till smooth gradually add the flour ground almonds and beaten eggs beat until smooth.

Spoon the mixture into an 8" round tin level the surface and cook for 45 to 50 mins until the centre is set.

For the topping

3/4.oz butter 3oz caster sugar 4 ½. Level tablespoons golden syrup 3 3/4.0z flaked almonds 2oz of alace cherries of cranberries ½.oz angelica

To make the topping Melt the butter, syrup and sugar together, then stir in the remaining ingredients. Remove the cake from the oven and add the topping, return the cake to the oven for approx. a further 10 mins or until the flaked almonds start to turn golden brown. Allow the cake to cool for 10mins before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

POLICE MATTERS

From March 1st the fine for mobile phone use whilst driving is being increased to £200 and 6 penalty points, which in the case of a driver of less than two years would mean a loss of licence. Despite widespread publicity of the possible tragic outcomes of this act it is still a common sight to see drivers distracted by their inability to ignore mobile media devices whilst in control of a potentially lethal vehicle. Persons guilty of this offence and other motoring offences are now also risking being reported and prosecuted through OPERATION SNAP in which members of the public can submit footage online from dash cams, pedal cycle cams or any other media footage they may have that supports evidence of a motoring offence. Information and guidance can be found on the North Wales Police public website as well as other advice and information on a variety of subjects.

Also in regard to road safety members of public can report untaxed vehicles on the road directly on the DVLA website where status of the vehicle can be checked. Abandoned vehicles can likewise be reported to Wrexham County Borough Council on their website. Persons caught driving under the influence of illegal drugs are increasing due to introduction of new testing equipment and consequences are similar to being caught driving with excess alcohol. Any information regarding the above or any other anti-social or criminal activity can be reported to North Wales Police helping to keep your local and wider community safer.
