# Funding approved for a new playground in Garth

Children in Garth are to get a new playground thanks to a £43,000 grant from funding body WREN.

The money awarded by WREN's FCC Community Action Fund, will be used to refurbish and buy new play equipment at the Garth playground.

Cllr. Mark Valentine who is a member of Llangollen Rural Community Council believes the facility will make a huge difference to the lives of children living in the area. He stated: "This project will provide a real boost to the children of Garth. It's fantastic that WREN has awarded us this money and we're really looking forward to our new play area taking shape over the next few months. The community organised its own fundraising events and raised over £2,000 towards the cost of the refurbishments."

WREN is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community, biodiversity and heritage projects from funds donated by FCC Environment through the Landfill Communities Fund. Since 1998, WREN has granted over £200m to more than 7,000 projects which benefit people living within 10 miles of a FCC Environment landfill site.

Meleri Jones WREN Grant Manager said; "we are pleased to support a project that has shown such strong community involvement. The play area is in desperate need of updating"

Cllr. Valentine said "The project will ultimately see us provide a broader range of facilities from zip-wires to see-saws but to also include new picnic tables alongside areas for bio-diversity. As part of the application process we have conducted a tender exercise with specialists and now have all elements in place to enhance these community facilities".

The trees have been planted to screen the garages on Charles Avenue and are all of the hedging variety. They are a wildlife tree pack from the Woodland Trust that includes hawthorn, hazel, birch, rowan, blackthorn and dogwood .As these trees mature they will provide a plentiful food supply for the wild life . 





# **Pineapple Cheesecake**

4 oz. digestive biscuits finely crushed

12 oz. curd cheese

4 tbsp. butter, melted plus

extra for greasing

5 fl. oz. double cream whipped

 $3\frac{1}{2}$  oz. caster sugar

12 oz. Cream cheese

14 oz. canned pineapple slices

Juice of 1 lemon

2 tbsp. grated lemon rind

Pinch of fresh nutmeg to decorate (optional)

Put the crushed biscuits into a large bowl and mix in the melted butter. Grease an 8" loose bottomed cake tin with butter and then press the biscuit mixture evenly over the base.

Put the sugar into a separate bowl and stir in the lemon juice and the lemon rind. Add the cheeses and beat until thoroughly combined. Fold in the cream. Spread the cream mixture evenly over the biscuit layer. Cover with cling-film and place in the fridge to chill for at least 4 hours.

Remove the cheesecake from the fridge, turn out onto a serving platter and spread the pineapple slices over the top. Sprinkle over a little grated nutmeg, if using. Serve immediately.





### **POLICE MATTERS**

Anti-social Behaviour (ASB). The first thing people often associate with this is young people misbehaving but ASB covers a wide range of actions and behaviours and is basically anything that results in:

- Someone feeling personally threatened, or
- The creation of a public nuisance, or
- A detrimental impact on the environment, or on the quality of life of an individual/community

Littering, Dog Fouling, Speeding, Inconsiderate parking, Noise and Graffiti can all be considered a form of ASB and have a negative impact on any community. Since Wrexham Council have employed a private company to enforce littering and dog fouling matters I have heard numerous reports of people being ticketed for dropping cigarette ends and allowing dogs onto playgrounds and sports fields in the local area. This strict enforcement policy can be an expensive lesson for some but may result in a general change in attitude.

Speeding and inconsiderate parking can have serious consequences which can affect the local community more than most areas due to the dramatic increase in traffic in the summer months and the rural roads and shortage of nearby parking facilities. We don't get a huge amount of ASB reported in Llangollen Rural but it is regularly reported as amongst resident's main concerns.

Finally an appeal to parents as the children probably won't read the newsletter;-Please talk to your kids – sometimes what they see as 'just having a laugh' can have a really hurtful effect on other members of your community. They might not be breaking the law but that doesn't mean it's okay to behave that way.
