How a donation left in 1699 to help the poor grew into a helping hand is still going strong today.

The charity started on the 11th August 1699 by Evan ap Edwards from Llangollen who bequeathed the sum of £50 in his will to benefit the poor of the parish. Others followed with voluntary contributions from their own estates to be invested with a similar purpose. It would be the start of a fascinating local charity that is still going strong today.

Although the legacies of the likes of Evan ap Edwards were the catalyst for the charity, they were not the only source of funding. In olden days land owners (including the Chirk Castle & Ruthin Castle Estates) would have to pay a charge towards the charity, it could be something like a shilling a year. There are still two fields in Glyn Ceiriog on which the charge still applies - something like 50 shillings. The money is collected each year by the Glyntraian representative.

The organisation was originally named St. Thomas's Charity, which many people refer to it today. In the early 20th century it became the 'Llangollen Urban, Llangollen Rural and Glyntraian Welfare Charities.'

The charity has close ties with the church and the set-up of the charity's board has remained the same for hundreds of years with the vicar at the time the chairman. The old parish was split into three areas, known as 'traians'. There are three representatives from the parish church; one representative from Froncysyllte and one from Trevor and these will be Community Councillors. There are two representatives from Glyntraian (which is Glyn Ceiriog) and two from Llangollen town council. Llantysilio isn't included as it wasn't part of the old parish.

In the early years the fund paid for loaves of bread, which were distributed by the font at the back of St. Collen's Church. They were given out after the service on a Sunday, so that they couldn't just collect the bread and leave. When our forefathers said that the church was always full, there was usually a reason!

Today things are a lot different but the ethos of St Thomas' remains the same as it did in 1699. The poor of the parish no longer queue for a small loaf of bread each week but the initial investment to help people who died hungry hundreds of years ago is still making a difference. The trustees of the old charity meet each year, in November, to discuss how to distribute the funds.

As today we don't have poor people in the sense that we did in the past, vouchers are distributed to around 280 people each year, which the representatives feel are deserving of them. These are usually widows or the elderly. How much is available depends on the interest on the charities assets which are ever changeable.

This is continued at the top of the following page.

Throughout the year the trustees keep an eye out for people who they feel should be given the vouchers and they are distributed in time for Christmas. The vouchers are for provisions, coal or clothing to the value of ten pounds and are redeemable only in shops in Llangollen.

St. Thomas's is a fascinating little charity. It has had to change with the times but, thanks to the work of the trustees and the various benefactors who have contributed to it over the past few hundred years. It continues to spread a little goodwill into the 21st century.

The trustees for Llangollen Rural are: Cllr Mrs Joyce Evans who has been involved for over 25 years and Cllr Geraint Roberts who has been a trustee for about 4 years.

Festive mince pies

200g / plain flour, plus extra for dusting 300g / 10½ oz mincemeat 100g / 3½ oz butter 1 egg beaten, for sealing and glazing 25g / 1 oz icing sugar icing sugar for dusting 2 – 3 tbsp. milk

Preheat the oven to 180°C / 350°F/Gas Mark 4. Sift the flour into a mixing bowl. Using your fingertips, rub in the butter until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Mix in the sugar and egg yolk. Stir in enough milk to make soft dough, turn out onto a lightly floured work surface and knead lightly until smooth.

Shape the dough into a ball and roll out to a thickness of $1\,\mathrm{cm}$ /½inch. Use fluted cutters to cut around 12 rounds of $7\,\mathrm{cm}$ / $2^{3/4}$ inches diameter and 12 rounds of $5\,\mathrm{cm}$ / 2 inches diameter. Dust 12 tartlet tins with flour and line with the larger dough rounds. Prick the basis with a fork, then half- fill each pie with mincemeat. Brush beaten egg around the rims, then press the smaller dough rounds on top to seal. Make a small hole in the top of each one. Decorate the pies with Christmas trees made from dough trimmings. Brush all over with beaten egg, and then bake for $15\,\mathrm{minutes}$. Remove from the oven and cool on a wire rack. Dust with icing sugar and serve.

Police Matters

Dark nights, Christmas looming on the horizon! The usual seasonal crime prevention advice is still relevant:-

Ensure your property is locked and secured at all times. Leave a light on when you are out, or use a time switch on an indoor light. Put a time switch on a radio that has been tuned in to a chat station, this will give the impression that the house is occupied. Fit security lighting, either dusk to dawn energy efficient lighting that will come on automatically as dusk sets in, or brighter passive infrared activated lighting drawing attention to movement. Ensure that gates or access to the rear of the house are locked and secure. Don't forget to lock your shed as tools can be used to break in.

Secure windows, paying particular attention to those on the ground floor and above flat roof areas. Use locks and bolts and keep your keys out of sight and out of reach. Property mark your valuables by using your postcode and your house number or name. Some items are unsuitable for marking so photograph them, with a ruler in view to show the scale.

We are urging drivers to keep an eye out for vulnerable road users and to watch their speed as the clocks go back. Cyclists and pedestrians are also being advised to "be seen and be safe" as the end of British Summer Time approaches. Out and about during darkness for longer periods, the reduced visibility can make them harder to see. Cyclists should wear brightly-coloured or fluorescent clothing in daylight and reflective clothing or accessories in the dark. By law, cycles must have front and rear lights switched on in the dark and be fitted with reflectors.

Pedestrians, including joggers, are being reminded that it is hard for motorists to see them if they are wearing dark clothing.

A year round problem that is still being brought to my attention is the amount of litter on the Ward even in the vicinity of litter bins. A clean environment deters further littering and negative behaviour. Appropriate action will be taken in regard to any such offences identified.
