

Since our last newsletter it has been a very busy time for me and the other members of our Council, with the imminent takeover of the playgrounds. We have had several site meetings with Officers from Wrexham County Borough Council and our Solicitor to make sure that everything is in order before we take them over.

Whilst on the issue of playgrounds, I must refer to the 'Party in the Park' at Garth playground. It was indeed a wonderful day enjoyed by everyone. My sincere thanks go to the Aqueduct Community Association and in particular Audrey Bowen and Clare Valentine who worked so hard to ensure its success. It was indeed a tremendous effort. Thank you so much.

We are still waiting for the light by Cromwell Terrace in Garth with one or two minor issues still to be resolved.

A special meeting of Council was called to discuss with Darren Green from Wrexham County Borough Council the possible one way system on the Rhosycoed estate. The result of the consultation and the response from residents was that the majority were in favour of a one way system. Therefore subject to Wrexham County Borough Council accepting the recommendation, a one way system could be in place by October this year.

I must also refer to the 'Underneath the Arches' event. Several residents have made complaints to the Community Council about incidents connected with this event. We have written to Wrexham County Borough Council expressing your concerns.

We hope that as a result of a meeting we had with Wrexham County Borough Council that the parking problems in Trevor have now improved with cars now being parked on the field adjacent to the canal basin car park during the weekend.

Pineapple Cheesecake

115 g/4oz digestive biscuits, finely crushed
350g/12oz curd cheese
4 tbsp. butter, melted plus extra for greasing
150 ml/5 fl oz double cream, whipped
100 g/3¹/₂ oz caster sugar
400g/14 oz canned pineapple slices, drained and halved.
Juice of 1 lemon
2 tbsp grated lemon rind
350g/12 oz cream cheese
pinch of freshly grated nutmeg to decorate (optional)

Put the crushed biscuits into a large bowl and mix in the melted butter. Grease a 20cm/8 inch loose bottomed cake tin with butter, then press the biscuit mixture evenly over the base.

Put the sugar into a separate bowl and stir in the lemon juice and the lemon rind. Add the cheeses and beat until thoroughly combined. Fold in the cream. Spread the cream mixture evenly over the biscuit layer. Cover with cling film and place in the refrigerator to chill for at least 4 hours.

Remove the cheesecake from the refrigerator, turn out onto a serving platter and spread the pineapple slices over the top. Sprinkle over a little grated nutmeg, if using. Serve immediately.



POLICE MATTERS

In the recent past there have been changes for motorists with the tax disc for vehicles being abolished and there no longer being a need for the paper counterpart for the driving licence card. With no tax disc on display to evidence a vehicle being legally taxed, many people were wary that there would be an increase of untaxed vehicles on the road, however records kept at DVLA require keepers to tax vehicles or declare them off road (SORN). Any vehicles not taxed or used on the road when declared off road can be seized or reported and the owners fined. The DVLA website enables anybody to check whether a vehicle is taxed and has a current MOT certificate simply by entering the registration number and the make of the vehicle. If a vehicle is believed to be illegally used on the road it can be reported to the police.

North Wales Police have recently carried out a campaign against uninsured and illegal drivers which saw 40 vehicle seizures and over 80 arrests over a two week period. The crackdown targeted those driving whilst disqualified, driving with no insurance or driving without a valid licence. Throughout the campaign officers utilized ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) technology and worked closely with colleagues at the Motor Insurance Bureau and DVLA. North Wales Police has a robust strategy around enforcing the 'Fatal 5' offences which are drink and drug driving, dangerous driving including unnecessary risk taking, speeding, failing to wear a seatbelt and using a mobile phone whilst driving.

If you know of someone who is driving illegally – either without a license, insurance or is driving whilst disqualified, please contact North Wales Police on 101. Alternatively contact Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111. Alternatively you can contact officers via the new online web chat.
