Defibrillators

<u>Automated External Defibrillators are designed for use by untrained or briefly trained laypersons.</u> AEDs contain technology for analysis of heart rhythms. As a result, it does not require a trained health provider to determine whether or not a rhythm is shockable.

By making these units publicly available, AEDs have improved outcomes for sudden out-of-hospital cardiac arrests.

Defibrillators in the community will be able to provide a vital resource for gaining those extra vital minutes when dealing with a heart related emergency.

Did you know there are three defibrillators located within our community?

Trevor Basin

The defibrillator at Trevor basin is located on the wall of the public toilets in the disabled car park.

The family of Mr Norman Land funded this in his memory. Mr Land was a member of The Llangollen Canal Boat Trust.

Froncysyllte

There will soon be a defibrillator fitted on the outside wall of Fron Community Centre when enough funds have been raised. They have been busy raising funds in conjunction with Welsh Harts (the all Wales defibrillator charity), Fron Community Centre and Special Sergeants Darren Armour and Dan McNulty from Rhos Station (North Wales Police) who have also helped raise funds in order to have the defibrillator fitted.

Garth

This defibrillator has only recently been fitted and is located on the wall outside Hafren flats.





Defibrillators Continued

I am sure that by now some of you will have seen a new defibrillator by the front door to Hafren flats, Garth. This was fitted by The Wales Ambulance Service on 24th August 2018.

In the event of an emergency you should go to the defibrillator, dial 999 and they will then give you a code number to open the cabinet. The defibrillator is very easy to use and is self explanatory.

Free training on the use of the defibrillators will be given by The Wales Ambulance Service at Trevor & Garth Community Centre on Tuesday 18th September at 7.00pm. The training is open to the residents of Garth, Trevor and Froncysyllte and is free of charge.

PLEASE MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO ATTEND as we would like as many local people trained as possible who can use the defibrillators.

I would like to thank the residents of Garth for providing the funds to enable us to purchase a defibrillator and in particular *Francis Roberts & Son Funeral Directors, Barnett Engineering, WTE Printers, Prospect Cafe, Nant Ucha Farm and Llangollen Rotary* for their generous donations. Lemon Drizzle Tray Bake

222g/8oz butter 225g/8oz caster sugar 275g/10oz self raising flour 2 level tbs baking powder 4 large eggs 4 tbs milk Finely grated zest of 2 lemons

FOR THE CRUNCHY TOPPING 175g/6oz granulated sugar Juice of 2 lemons

Method

Heat the oven to 160c - 140c Gas mark 3. Grease a 30 x 23 x 4cm (12" x 9" x 1 1/2") tin and line with baking paper. Measure all ingredients for the tray bake into a large bowl and beat for about 2 mins until well blended. Turn the mixture into the tin and level the surface. Bake for 35-40 mins until the tray bake springs back when pressed lightly with a finger. Allow to cool in the tin for a few minutes then lift the cake out of the tin. Carefully take the paper off the cake and put onto a wire rack. Place over a tray to catch drips off the topping.

To make the topping, mix the sugar and lemon juice together in a bowl and gently spoon over the tray bake while it is still just warm leave to cool completely before cutting.

Police Matters

Over the summer I have noticed several pushbikes have been reported to North Wales Police in the Wrexham South area which have been apparently abandoned but in good state of repair and would have been quite costly when new. First thought of finder and ourselves is often that the bike has been stolen and later abandoned and as such the bike will be checked against reported stolen or lost property in the area. Recently I have been surprised by how many bikes have not been reported as lost or stolen and no owner can be identified. Stolen property is generally reported to the Police but it appears that many people do not bother to report lost property. Lost and Found property is now dealt with online by way of the "contact" section of the North Wales Police public website and it is generally worth reporting lost property of any value with as much detail as possible regarding description and where it was thought to be lost as it can be a pleasant surprise how many people will try to return found items to their owners. Certain categories of found property can be claimed by the finder if the rightful owner is not forthcoming.

The North Wales Police website also contains numerous methods of contacting North Wales Police if you feel "999" is not justified as I know ringing "101" has been frustrating to call on occasions. The website also provides information about different departments within the force and resources available including the relatively new drone deployment. Details of NWP structure, priorities and services are also given along with the chance to give your view on NWP.

There has also been a survey commissioned by the Chief Constable and the North Wales Police and Crime Commissioner which gives the public of North Wales the opportunity to feed back their perception of services provided by the Police, feelings of confidence and safety, and their general views of policing. The public are also asked about their views on the priorities set by the Police and Crime Commissioner. The survey is undertaken by Opinion Research Services, based in Swansea, who are contacting randomly chosen members of the public between now and the end of December.

One of the benefits of the weather has been the number of visitors that our area has attracted none more so than the Aqueduct. Whilst we should be proud of the beauty that we have around us it does come with its own problems. The increase in numbers has caused parking problems and this has been an issue all summer long with my phone ringing non-stop with complaints regarding this issue.

Since the last Newsletter the new car park has opened on the old warehouse site but it has not solved the parking problem. Over the last couple of weeks I have attended meetings with Council officials to try and resolve the problem. Over many years our Community has not received the best of attention in terms of gritting in the winter months. I have held meetings with those responsible and hopefully things will improve this winter.

Finally I would like to thank the entrants into our Annual Gardening competition and also to all those who made it an enjoyable event. Conditions weren't exactly favourable this year given the extremely dry conditions but it was a splendid turnout once again.






Ysgol Dinas Bran
