Local Council Elections

By Sue Jones

It was brought to my attention that many people don't realise that there are council elections on Thursday 4th May 2017. It also became clear that the procedure for the election of community/town councillors is unknown to a large number of the electorate. To help to clarify the situation I have précised the procedure for the election of councillors, (taken from 'Community Councils Elections - The Candidates Guide'), below.

Lead Authority

The election of members to town and community councils comes under the jurisdiction of the Lead Authority, (Wrexham County Borough Council). Community and town councils are restricted by law in taking any part in these elections. Advertising the date and venue for local elections is the responsibility of the Lead Authority, as is overseeing that all nomination papers are valid and comply with the law. The cost of local council elections is covered by each individual council with the payment made to the Lead Authority.

If an election proper is called for, the cost is considerably higher.

Qualifications for Candidature

- To be qualified to be elected a member of a community/town council a person must be 21 years of age or over at the date of his/her nomination and be a local government elector of that community (i.e. be on the area's Electoral Role).
- Have, during the whole of the twelve months preceding the day on which he/ she is nominated as a candidate, occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the community.
- His/her principal place of work in the twelve months preceding the day on which he/she is nominated as a candidate has been in the area of the community.
- Has resided either in the community, or within 3 miles thereof during the whole
 of the twelve months preceding the day on which he/she is nominated as a
 candidate.

Disqualifications for Election

- Holding a paid office under the lead authority
- Bankruptcy.
- Been sentenced to a term of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) of not less than 3 months, without the option of a fine during the 5 years preceding the election.
- Being disqualified under any enactment relating to corrupt or illegal practices.

Local Council Elections continued.

Election Timetable

The election period lasts a little over 4 weeks.

The Government have announced that the date of the Council Elections will be Thursday 4th May 2017 and that the following procedure will take place:

Nomination

Every candidate must be nominated on a nomination paper in the prescribed form, the notes to which are complicated and should be read carefully. The nomination paper must be subscribed by a proposer and seconder who must be on the electoral role of the community.

Consent to Nomination

The nomination is not valid unless the candidate's consent to nomination, given in writing on or within one month before the last day for delivery of nomination papers, is delivered at the place and within the time appointed for the delivery of nomination papers.

Statement of persons nominated

On the seventeenth day before the election the returning officer is required to publish a statement of the persons who stand nominated.

Acceptance of Office / Code of Conduct

A person elected to the office of community councillor must make a *Declaration* of Acceptance of Office and sign a Code of Conduct in the prescribed form before or at the first meeting of the community council after his/her election.

If you are interested in becoming a community councillor don't let the above put you off, it's not as difficult as it sounds!

Homelink Library Service

If you are disabled or have difficulty getting to your local library a Homelink library service is provided by Wrexham County. This offers a home visit every four weeks and provides access to the whole range of library and reference services, including books, Audios, CDs and DVDs.

Roberts & Maginnis Brickworks

My sincere thanks to the publishers Gwasg Carreg Gwatch, Llannwst for giving me permission to use this article from the book by Andrew Connolly – Life in the Victorian Brickworks in Flintshire & Denbighshire. If you have any photos or anecdotes about the brickworks that you would like to share with our readers please let us know.



The impressive factory at Garth / Trevor was developed from a very insignificant country works, which featured an incident in early history which reads more like a scene from the Wild West. We know from the railway maps that the site was farmland in 1858, and the first tenant to establish a brickyard here was John Wright:

Wrexham Advertiser 9th August, 1862 – Club law at Garth. Mr Whalley appeared before the bench to complain of one of his tenants being forcibly turned out of a brickyard by John Wright and a number of men that he brought with him. The tenant is Mr Moses Evans of the Australia Arms, who stated to the bench that on 30th July John Wright, Edwin Wright, Charles Wright and two other men came and took forcible possession of a brickyard that he had rented from Mr Whalley for the last four months. Before that time the brickyard was held by John Wright. They put a lock on the gate and stuck up a paper cautioning him against entering. The wife of John Wright had a pistol and said that she would shoot anyone who attempted to enter. The bench agreed to grant warrants for their apprehension. Moses Evans had therefore succeeded John Wright circa April 1862. Most likely because Wright could not manage to pay his rents. Incidentally, the works later became known as the Australia Brickworks after the adjacent inn at which Moses Evans would have probably been lodging.

Moving on to 1864 the map of the brickworks is shown, still in the occupation of Evans with its single tiny kiln near the roadside where the offices of the future works were to be, and behind the kin was a small clay bank and brick shed. Due west to brickyard was a small stone quarry held by Thomas and Jonathan Roberts, whilst behind that to the north west was a small colliery shaft held by Joseph Wright; obviously a relative of the infamous John. In October and November 1866 the "Australia Brickworks Trevor" was offered for letting by Moses Evans, due to his recent bankruptcy in April with debts of £1,273, and by 1868 the trade directories

were showing that the quarry owners JH & T Roberts had taken on the works. As an interesting footnote, the old Welsh name for this district was Chwarele, which means "quarry", and how that name came to be changed was all down to the men in charge of the Great Western Railway. Wrexham Advertiser 12th June 1869 —About midway between Ruabon and Llangollen on a branch of the G W R there is a station called Trevor. When the branch was first opened this station was named Chwarele, but as English travellers always despaired of pronouncing the word, the nearest approach to the sound any Saxon was ever known to accomplish being Gorilla, the name was changed to the more mellifluous one of Trevor.

By 1870 a certain Mr Charles Mason had acquired the works with a working capital of over £2,500 to back him up. He continued the business until having to take out a £2,000 mortgage in 1873; easily enough accomplished as the place was valued at over £7,000 and in 1875 – 6 he entered



into partnership with Mr Anthony Shelmerdine, who contributed a further £1,500 for the privilege.

The British Architect 1878 – At Garth Trevor on the lower edge of the Coal Measures, from the shaly and iron stained clays and sandstone, Mr Charles Mason produces large quantities of good, sound and serviceable cherry red bricks, which are well adapted for all ordinary building purposes. The clay of the "Chwarele coal" occurs abundantly on this property. Its productions are of much the same character as those of the Llwyneinion clay. It has not however as yet been worked to any extent by Mr Mason.


It seems that whichever persons had held these works, things had not fared well for any of them. On 1st October 1880 the "Trevor Fireclay Works & Colliery" held an auction of stock "under distress for rent", which indicates how poorly their trade had proved, and in 1881 Mason decided to retire from the business.

- 18 oz Porridge Oats 6 oz No Soak Apricots (cut into small pieces)
- 6 oz Sunflower Seeds

Directions

- 1. Pre-heat the oven 160c, 140c fan, Gas mark 3
- 2. Put butter marge, sugar, golden syrup in a saucepan and melt over a low heat
- 3. When melted stir in the oats, apricots and sunflower seeds, mix well
- 4. Turn into a 10 inch square lined tin level the surface
- 5. Bake in the oven for about 40 mins until golden brown

Hopefully you will all have a good Christmas and have no need to deal with the Police over the festive period. Christmas can be an exciting fun time or the most stressful time of the year with queues on the roads as well as in the shops. Recently we have been conducting speed checks in Llangollen Rural and surrounding areas which have not identified any major speeding issues and actually appeared to show drivers travelling well under the speed limit. While we are aware this is not a true reflection of driving throughout the region it does demonstrate that people are generally aware of the speed limits and what is a safe manner of driving. Over the coming few months we will find more traffic delays due to more motorists on the road and possible accidents due to road conditions and the darker nights and inevitable roadworks. If possible allow enough time for journeys rather than risk a speeding fine or worse. Speeding offences can increase insurance premiums as well as the fine and points on your licence and most Police forces will have winter campaigns targeting speeding and illegal vehicles on the road.

As usual over Christmas do not leave valuables on display in parked vehicles or vehicles unlocked which can be tempting to opportunist thieves. Cars idling unattended outside houses or Newsagents on icy mornings can also be targeted and probably would result in invalid Insurance claims.
