After all the hard work hopefully a new light will be installed shortly. We are now waiting for the Legal Department, at Wrexham County Borough Council to complete the legal work – so fingers crossed we will have a light soon!

Finally, I would like to invite any member of our community to attend our meetings. You will find that we go through a considerable amount of work on your behalf and very much hope that our Community is all the better for our efforts despite the financial restraints that we now face.

Tour de 2 Welsh

My name is Ben Larwood and I am a Cadet Sergeant in the Air Cadets in Ruabon. At the beginning of July I will be doing a sponsored cycle ride around the 21 Air Cadet squadrons of No. 2 Welsh Wing. It is just over 300 miles in total and covers North and Mid Wales. I will be completing it over 4 days. I live in Garth and along with my involvement in the Air Cadets and cycling it seemed a great idea to combine these interests to raise money for two great causes. The money that I raise will be split between the Royal British Legion and the LMS Patriot Project. The latter are building a new steam locomotive from scratch endorsed by the RBL. The locomotive, called "The Unknown Warrior", will play a major part in the centenary remembrance of the First World War in 2018.



I will be starting from Llandudno on the first day, which will take me to the squadrons at Colwyn Bay, Rhyl, Prestatyn, Holywell, Flint, Hawarden, Mold, Rhuthin and Wrexham before I will finish in Ruabon, at my squadron 1251 Berwyn. The second leg starts at Ruabon and I will visit the squadrons at Chirk, Welshpool, Newtown and Llandrindod Wells where I will end the day. The latter squadron is the starting point of the third day which will take me



between just two squadrons; I will be finishing at Ardudwy squadron in Llanbedr. The final day will take me through Snowdonia to squadrons in Caernarfon, Bangor and at Mona, I will then visit the last squadron in Holyhead before finishing at the gates to RAF Valley.

I will be grateful for any donation I receive for doing my ride.





Apple and Almond Flan

3oz butter
6oz plain flour
1oz ground almonds
1oz caster sugar
1 egg yolk
1 tbsp. cold water
¼. tsp almond essence
1 ½.lb cooking apples

For the topping
4oz plain flour
¼.tsp ground mixed spice
2oz butter cut in small cubes
2oz Demerara sugar
2oz flaked almonds

1. To make the pastry, rub the butter into the flour until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the almonds and sugar. Whisk the egg yolk, water and almond essence together and mix into the dry ingredients to form soft dough. Knead until smooth, wrap and leave to rest for 20mins.
 2. For the topping, sift the flour and spice into a bowl and rub in the butter. Stir in the sugar and almonds. Roll out the pastry and use to line a 23cm - 9in loose-base flan tin. Trim the top and chill for 15mins.
 3. Preheat a baking sheet or tray in the oven at 180c. Peel, core and slice the apples thinly. Arrange in the flan dish in overlapping circles.
 4. Cover with the topping mixture pressing it on lightly, put the flan dish on the hot baking sheet or tray (as the juice may run over) at 180c for 25mins turn down to 170c for a further 25mins until golden brown.



POLICE MATTERS

Owning a dog brings a great deal of enjoyment but also carries with it many responsibilities. Dogs can be dangerous and a nuisance in many ways. Dog owners can do much to reduce the risks:

It is your responsibility to ensure that your dog is not able to stray from home. Stray dogs can cause road traffic collisions, attack and seriously injure children, worry livestock and foul land. If a dog appears to be straying, it may be picked up by the dog warden and taken to local kennels.

The Control of Dogs Order 1992 mandates that any dog in a public place must wear a collar with the name and address of the owner engraved or written on it, or engraved on a tag.

It is important to ensure that your dog is kept under proper control at all times.

The Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 states that any dog is dangerously out of control if:

- it injures a person, or
- it behaves in a way that makes a person worried that it might injure them.

The law applies everywhere including private property. A court can order the destruction of dogs found to be dangerously out of control.

The amended Dangerous Dogs Act came into effect in England and Wales on 13 May 2014. This applies to all dog owners no matter what size or breed.

Changes to the Act means dog owners can now face prosecution if their dog attacks a person in their home or on any private property, except if they attack a trespasser. The maximum sentences for allowing a dog to attack someone have also been increased.

The maximum prison sentences in England and Wales are now:

Up to 14 years, from two years, for a fatal dog attack

Up to five years, from two years, for injury

Up to three years if an assistance dog is attacked (Guide Dog, Hearing Dog etc)

Further measures to help tackle irresponsible dog ownership will come into force in April 2016 when microchipping will be a legal requirement for all dogs in England and Wales.

County Councillor's Diary

This is a brief update of the ongoing issues within the Llangollen Rural Ward.

Community Council AGM Councillor Mr Elfed Morris, was installed as the new chairman for the ensuing year, I would like to wish our new chair every success during his term of office. Councillor Mrs Alyson Winn, was elected as the vice chair. I would like to say a special thanks to the outgoing chairperson Councillor Mrs Joyce Evans, who did a great job during her term of office; it was a pleasure to work with her, and her fellow councillors.

Planting The Clerk, Mrs Sue Jones has put the wheels in motion, and is ordering the bedding plants for this coming year. What a colourful year we had in the ward. It's thanks to Sue Jones, the volunteers and Community Councillors that make this happen. Let's hope for a nice summer like last year.

Litter Picking Thanks to Mrs Ceri Postle from Wrexham Council, and Shane Hughes of Tidy Wales, they recently organised a litter pick day, which once again was a great success. A special thanks to all the volunteers who helped out on the day.

Site meeting with Scottish Power I was recently called to a site meeting on George Avenue, with Scottish Power and Wrexham Council, regarding the supply to the sub-station. I was told that there was a great urgency to renew the cables, which supplies over 300 houses. Please find below the proposal, and time scale.

Proposal We are proposing to lay two new high voltage cable from the existing substation by the garages, to pick up an existing high voltage circuit (that runs all the way to Llangollen), which is situated in the green in George Avenue. The exact route of this is detailed on the attachment.

The benefits of the doing this is that the residents will now be fed via an underground cable directly from our Monsanto primary substation via some 600m of cable, and no overhead line so they will not be impacted by overhead line transient faults.

As we intending to lay two HV cables under this project, should the cable from Monsanto fail, then we can quickly restore supplies from Llangollen, without having to wait for generators to arrive.

During this work, I am also intending to refurbish our equipment in the substation.

In summary, we are trying to doing this work is the only way we can improve the network to minimize the disruption to electricity supplies, which can only be a good thing.

Timescales Having thought about this during the course of the day, I am thinking that the work would be best carried out in September, for the following reasons:

- a) As we will need to lift the turf across the green, it will stand better chance of not drying out and shrinking if we did it when the climate was cooler
- b) July, August will be school holidays, and having open excavations when the children are on holiday is best avoided.
- c) I am hoping that all this work could be completed within 2 weeks, with a start date somewhere near when the school term starts again.

Post 16 Education Transport Due to budget cutbacks Wrexham Council will be withdrawing this funding from September 2016.

I asked our AM Ken Skates to take this up with the minister in Cardiff, please see extract from the reply that Ken received,

“There is no duty on local authorities within the Learner Travel Wales measure 2008 to provide free transport for post 16 learners. The provision of school transport is funded by the Revenue Support Grant (RSG) to local authorities. The RSG for the learner travel budget is around £85m for the financial year. We will be implementing discounted travel for young people from September 2015. This scheme will offer 16, 17 and 18 year olds one-third discounts on all of their local bus journeys, including journeys to places of training or education.”

Skip Day Due to unforeseen circumstances this day was cancelled, we are awaiting a new date to be confirmed.

Local Bus Service There is still nothing to report on this matter, the operators are still altering the service across the county.
